

Lecture Four: General and Special Revelation

INTRODUCTION:

REVELATION – because man is finite and God is infinite, if man is to know God it must come about by God's revelation of Himself to man.

GENERAL REVELATION – provides evidences of the existence of God at all times and to all mankind.

- 1. It gives light to all and makes all accountable to God.
- 2. It brings condemnation when rejected.

SPECIAL REVELATION – is not provided for all of mankind and is not available at all times.

lt is...

- 2. partial.
- 3. accurate.
- 4. purposeful.
- 5. progressive.

GENERAL & SPECIAL REVELATION

General revelation includes all that God has revealed in the world around us, including man, while special revelation includes various means He used to communicate His message in what was codified in the Bible.

GENERAL REVELATION – reveals God's glory.

SPECIAL REVELATION – reveals His plan for redemption.

 - Reveals God is benevolent to all people e
- 2C. Acts 14:15-17
 - Reveals God provides food for all people
- 3C. Daniel 2:21
 - Reveals God raises up and removes rulers
- 3B. In Conscience
 - 1C. Romans 2:14-15
 - Reveals God has placed his law within the hearts of all people
- 2A. Special Revelation 2 ways God has specially revealed Himself
 - 1B. In Christ
 - 1C. John 1:18
 - Reveals what the Father is like
 - 2C. John 5:36-37
 - Reveals the Father's compassion
 - 3C. John 6:63; 14:10
 - Reveals that the Father gives life to those who believe in the Son
 - 2B. In Scripture
 - 1C. 2 Timothy 3:16, 17
 - Reveals all the doctrine, rebuke, correction, and guidance that the Christian needs for good living
 - 2C. 2 Peter 1:21
 - Reveals all that God has chosen to disclose through human authors directed by the Holy Spirit
