Water Baptism is not...

- ...a prescribed condition for church membership.
- ...a work for salvation.
- ...washing away of sins.

Water Baptism is...

- ...a public ceremony.
- ...prescribed by Jesus Christ.
- ...practiced by the early church.
- ...expounded theologically by the apostles in the Epistles.
- ...a public confession of our salvation in Christ.
- ...a public identification with Jesus Christ.
- ...a declaration of personal faith.
- ...a public acknowledgement of our dependence upon Jesus Christ alone for our salvation.
- ...immersion in water signifying our substitutionary death in Christ.
- ...a picture of our identity with Christ's death and resurrection.
- ...a depiction of the death of the old man and spiritual new birth.
- ...an ordinance that is obligatory for every believer.

Spirit Baptism is...

- ...into Christ's death on the cross (Rom 6:3-4).
- ...a washing by regeneration from the penalty of our sins (Titus 3:5).
- ...a cleansing from the guilt of our sins (1 Jn 1:7).
- ...a deliverance from the power of sin in our lives (Rom6:6; 8:11).
- ...being raised to walk in newness of life (Rom 6:4).
