		I do hereby recommend, that Wednesday, the 9th day of May next, be observed throughout
		the United States as a day of solemn humiliation, fasting, and prayer; that the citizens of these
		States, abstaining on that day from their customary worldly occupations, offer their devout
		addresses to the Father of Mercies agreeably to those forms or methods which they have

severally adopted as the most suitable and becoming; that all religious congregations do, with the deepest humility, acknowledge before God the manifold sins and transgressions with which we are justly chargeable as individuals and as a nation, beseeching Him at the same time, of His infinite grace, through the Redeemer of the World, freely to remit all our offenses, and to incline us by His Holy Spirit to that sincere repentance and reformation which may afford us reason to hope for his inestimable favor and heavenly benediction; that it be

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made the subject of particular and earnest supplication that our country may be protected from all the dangers which threaten it; that our civil and religious privileges may be preserved inviolate and perpetuated to the latest generations; that our public councils and magistrates may be especially enlightened and directed at this critical period;

- I do hereby recommend accordingly, that Thursday, the 25th day of April next, be observed throughout the United States of America as a day of solemn humiliation, fasting, and prayer; that the citizens on that day abstain as far as may be from their secular occupations, devote the time to the sacred duties of religion in public and in private; that they call to mind our numerous offenses against the Most High God, confess them before Him with the sincerest penitence, implore His pardoning mercy, through the Great Mediator and Redeemer, for our past transgressions, and that through the grace of His Holy Spirit we may be disposed and enabled to yield a more suitable obedience to His righteous requisitions in time to come; that He would interpose to arrest the progress of that impiety and licentiousness in principle and practice so offensive to Himself and so ruinous to mankind; that He would make us deeply sensible that "righteousness exalteth a nation, but sin is a reproach to any people"; that He would turn us from our transgressions and turn His displeasure from us;

- 2) Beseech Him to remit our offenses
- 3) Beseech Him to incline us by His Holy Spirit to repentance and reformation
- 4) Make supplication that our religious privileges are preserved for future generations
- 5) That enlightenment and direction may be given to our public councils and magistrates
- 6) That we call to mind our offenses against the Most High God
- 7) That we confess them with sincere penitence our offenses
- 8) That we implore His pardoning mercy for our past transgressions through Christ
- 9) That His Holy Spirit disposes and enables us to yield to righteousness.
- 10) That He would interpose to arrest impiety and licentiousness in principle and practice.
